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

Enjoy a home-cooked meal with the family in their house and get a true insight into the importance of meals at home in Vietnamese culture. While tasting delicious meals, the hosts are more than happy to share their life stories and enthusiasm for music. Wrap up your lunch or dinner with a private performance of the traditional Vietnamese music instrument 'Dan Bau' will be held at home after the meal. If you wish, you also could learn how to play a few notes on this instrument.

Ms Ai is a passionate and well-known chef in Hanoi, who was in the top 5 in Master Chef 2014. She is an expert in culinary and actively promotes healthy food among Vietnamese. Today, you will have a chance to learn the secrets of cooking delicious Vietnamese meals and try your hands at cooking under the guidance of an experienced chef.

Once you meet Chef Ai, she will take you to the local wet market, where you will witness the authentic and busy life of the neighborhood. Ms. Ai will show you how to select the freshest and most important ingredients for local dishes and will guide you through the sights, sounds, and flavors of the bustling market.

Experience the art of water puppetry, a unique form of folk art that originated in Vietnam, with a local artisan. Mr. Liem Phan is a passionate performer who inherited his talent and tradition from his father. He has performed in several countries outside Vietnam and has a profound love for playing with puppets, making them, and creating mini-stages for water puppetry.

Today you will take a 30-minute drive from your hotel to a small alley in Hanoi where Mr. Liem lives and works. During your visit, you will sit down for a cup of tea and listen to Mr. Liem Phan's stories about the origin of water puppetry and his memorable experiences traveling around the world to share with others Vietnamese culture and folklore. Afterward, you will enjoy a 30-minute private show featuring lion dances, buffalo fighting, rice farming, and boat racing, among others, on Mr. Liem Phan's private mini water puppet stage on the top floor of his house. After the show, you can choose between learning to handle the puppets in the water or taking part in making and painting the puppets in the workshop.

With its 300-year history, Dao Thuc village is cherished as a place that preserves the essence of traditional water puppetry. Where else can you witness this unique art form in such a special setting? This ancient village was once in danger of losing its cherished tradition, but thanks to the dedication of one artisan, the art of water puppetry has experienced a remarkable revival in recent years.

Just a short drive from Hanoi lies the peaceful village of Dao Thuc. Your journey begins with a visit to a local workshop, where you'll learn the inspiring story of how a family revived water puppetry, ensuring its future for generations to come.

A member of the Vietnamese Fine Arts Association, he pushes artistic boundaries with his passion, defying the limitations of tradition, style, and even politics. His talents extend far beyond the canvas, encompassing the worlds of environmentalism, sculpture, performance art, music, and even painting.

Visit his amazing world through a 20-minute journey from Hanoi's heart to Mr. Khanh's unique studio. Immerse yourself in the world of this modern artist by spending a night at his homestay, a haven designed by his vision. You will get a chance to unwind amidst the distinct charm of underground houses, treehouses, and stilt houses, each reflecting a unique personality you won't find anywhere else. Mr. Khanh will personally welcome you and share his life experiences, making your stay truly unforgettable.

Warmly welcome you to Anh Khanh's studio home. Begin your journey with a delightful cocktail reception as you peacefully admire his exhibition on the ground floor of his wooden stilt house and its charming courtyard.

Wandering through the lush garden, dotted with sculptures, you'll have the chance to discover Anh Khanh's fascinating life story. A former policeman, his bold artistic explorations have made him a captivating figure, sometimes creating gentle ripples in Vietnam's more traditional art scene.

STREET FOOD TASTING WITH FOOD BLOGGER

Take a street food tour to explore the best culinary spots of the city with a food blogger – Mr. Van Cong Tu. He started his blog in 2005 and has been sharing his enormous passion for food and culture for all these years.

Meet Mr Tu at your hotel lobby and take a walk through the Old Quarter. You will visit two bustling markets: Thanh Ha and Dong Xuan, which are alive with the sights and sounds of Hanoi. Explore the dried goods and aromatics spices that are essential for Vietnamese cuisine, and taste the local delicacies and remarkable dishes such as pho tiu (rice noodles with scrummy slices of roasted pork, with bean sprouts, herbs, crushed nuts, and dried shallots) and bun dau (a rustic dish of Northern Vietnam with rice vermicelli, tofu, and shrimp paste). Along the way, Mr. Tu will introduce to you the Vietnamese food culture.

Then, walk down to Hang Than Street to view ceremonial cake stalls and taste a special French-influenced dessert while learning about traditions and food gifts for celebrations.

Continue back to the Old Quarter via Hang Cot Street to check out specially treated seasonal fruits, the common snacks in Vietnam. Walk along Phung Hung Street through temporary market stalls, where you can see the changing market scene of Hanoi, and how modernization is shaping tradition. At the end of the tour, stop at one of the Old Quarter's busiest coffee shops for a well-earned sit-down and coffee before transferring back to your hotel.



CYCLING, FARMING AND COOKING IN HANOI'S COUNTRYSIDE

Here, you'll gain an authentic insight into local life and hands-on experience in the daily activities of this non-touristic yet beautiful part of Vietnam. We have a deep connection with the local community and are heavily involved in their affairs, supporting them for different events, and want to share with you the beauty of the place and people's hearts here. We invite you to be our valued guest and join our community for a day to become an integral part of our shared experience. Meet your guide at the hotel lobby around 8:00 a.m. and depart to Ba Vi, the scenic countryside area on the outskirts of Hanoi.

Your first stop is at Ri Village, where you meet your host Mr. Duoc, who is a Vietnam War veteran and tea-farm owner. Have a chat with Mr. Duoc and listen to the stories of his life during the war while enjoying the welcome drink and snacks. Later, visit the tea plantation, where you will learn how to pick the best tea leaves to make the most wonderful beverage in Vietnam. Carry on with the tea production at Mr. Duoc's small workshop, where most of the work is manual.

Then, take a short drive to Moc village, where you will meet your next host, Mrs. Chin, who will teach you how to cook local Vietnamese dishes. Enjoy the meals you cooked for lunch in a beautiful tropical garden.

Have a short break after lunch, and join Mrs. Chin for a walk around the village. You will visit some local families to understand the rural lifestyle and see how they make tofu, conical hats, and other local products. Then, enjoy a cycling trip through beautiful rice paddy fields.

Wrap up your countryside tour with traditional feet soak in warm water with herbs, following the traditional recipes of the Muong ethnic minority. It will relax you (and your feet) after cycling around the village before heading back to your hotel in Hanoi.



ONE DAY OF LIFE LIKE A HANOIAN

Today, you will get a real insight into the local lifestyle. Instead of visiting the famous landmarks, we will take you through off-the-beaten-path routes for tourists, but very common for locals. You will see life from the local perspective and have lunch with a family of 3 generations to learn more about living in Hanoi.

Start your morning by visiting the "standing newspaper", and learn about the poor period for the Hanoians when buying a newspaper was a luxury. Then, stop at a local coffee shop to watch and listen to the sounds of daily life in the Old Quarter before transferring to Gioi Market – the corner where thousands of trade goods are sold, from nails and batteries to motors, electronic goods, and refrigeration equipment. You will be surprised at how many little stores are in the middle of the street, and the difficulty for motorbikes to wind through the tiny streets.

Continue your exploration by the trail ride passing the iconic Long Bien Bridge and follow your guide along the tracks to the "cuisine street", where you can find many tasty dishes and snacks before visiting the local family to have lunch together. Feel the warm hospitality of Hanoians and have a cup of tea while enjoying the chat with the family member. You will taste Vietnamese traditional homemade meals for lunch, which will be a great memory of your time here. Later, we will take you back to your hotel.

Hanoi has more than 1000 years of history that passed many ups & downs and brings the capital charms & attractions. Today, you will explore & discover the traces of wartime, guided by the veteran who used to be a soldier during the American war from 1970 to 1975 - to get a glimpse of the history and his authentic experience.

Start your tour by the Hanoi Hilton, where American POWs were kept. Then, head to Truc Bach & Huu Tiep Lakes in Ngoc Ha village, where many B52 planes were shot down, and you could see the remains of one of them right in the lake.

Afterward, drive to Thang Long Royal Citadel (closed on Mondays), where we will visit the underground war bunker. This bunker played an important role in the American War, especially during the 12 days and nights of the Ha Noi - Dien Bien Phu air battle in 1972. Finish the trip with a visit to the extensive Army Museum (closed on Mondays and Fridays), where you will see the repository of Vietnam's military history, which includes rooms full of war propaganda, photographs, and documents from China, France, and the US wars.

Special note: *Thang Long Royal Citadel is closed on Mondays and the Army Museum is closed on Mondays and Fridays*

Today you will explore the different sides of Hanoi and enjoy the bustling atmosphere of the city in the morning. Walk through the hidden narrow alleys, meet with the locals for a cup of tea, and indulge in the delicious meals in the vintage restaurant.

Start your morning by exploring the little alleys and seeing the daily lives of locals. Take a seat on Hanoi's iconic very small chairs in the vintage coffee shop and taste a cup of Vietnamese coffee. This is also a perfect opportunity for people-watching, to get a better idea of the daily activities of the locals.

After that, we make our way through a small alley, which is just big enough to fit through, to the Hanoi Church, which is a highlight of the regal architecture of Hanoi. From here, we will move to the busy Nha Chung Alley with vendors selling food or vegetables in the mornings.

Then visit the old French house, where you will meet a local who has a strong attachment to this place. Engage with him to discover more about the change of people, life, and thoughts on the future of this remarkably old city. Finish this tour by having lunch at a vintage Vietnamese restaurant decked out in 70's décor that will take you back in time to a post-liberated Hanoi.

Today, you will discover the hidden side of Hanoi, where locals live and work alongside the railway. Your guide will take you to explore the markets and introduce you to the people who share their space with the railway.

At 8 a.m., you will be picked up from your hotel and taken to the food market on Kham Thien Street to see the daily shopping activities of the locals. Then, you will venture down narrow streets to Alley Le Duan for a view of one of the city's 'railway streets,' where people enjoy coffee on the tracks and make way for oncoming trains. You will also explore the Hanoi station, known for its unique blend of colonial and socialist architecture.

After a stop at Cua Dong Street for a refreshment, you will be driven to Gia Lam Station to catch a train to Long Bien Station. Upon arrival, you can visit the bustling market shadowed by the Long Bien Bridge, a French relic that played a crucial role in the Vietnam War.

On this unique half-day photo tour, we will explore the iconic locations and hidden corners of Hanoi and learn how to take great photos. Following the classic structure of the 3 picture story, we discover the fundamentals of travel photography and gain a unique insight into the real Hanoi, leaving with a collection of fantastic pictures to share with friends and family.

On this tour, you will visit the most atmospheric parts of the city, which apart from beautiful views, have an interesting story behind them. Start the photo shoot at the historic Long Bien Bridge, which is one of the symbols of the city. Feature authentic gatherings of local people in your photos while visiting the bustling Long Bien and Dan Xuan markets, which also have an interesting historical background.

Our next series of photos is dedicated to street photography and portraits, and the maze of the Old Quarter streets is a perfect place for it. Here, we will learn how to approach and interact with people for quality portraits. We will also visit the railway tracks to witness and take atmospheric photos of how people live right alongside the railway.

Then practice storytelling in the photos at the old apartment zones built in 1975. Here we will see different architectures before and after the Vietnam-American War that feature the story of local people, still living in these apartments. Finish the tour with a cocktail at a local artist's studio, where you can take part in the final photography workshop for expert feedback.

Travel to the photogenic Red River Delta village of Tho Ha via a 45min drive from Hanoi and a short ferry across the Cau River.

The Red River Delta is an agriculturally rich area producing 20% of Vietnam's rice crop. Despite the increasing industrialization of the area, the village of Tho Ha has remained mostly unaffected by modern development. Walk through the village's narrow terracotta-tiled alleyways, a reminder of its history as one of Vietnam's three oldest ceramic centres.

Notice the many bamboo racks filled with drying rice paper, speaking to the current occupation of many of its inhabitants after the pottery industry faded. A visit here presents an authentic portrait of a typical Vietnamese village with some of the homes dating back more than a century.

Visit the 17th century Tho Ha Pagoda with its triple gate, belfry, and forecourt carved with dragons, clouds, and flowers. Enjoy a conversation with one of the local residents to gain insights into life in the village before returning to Hanoi.

Take a 60-minute flight to Ha Long Bay, enjoying the scenic views of lush green rice fields and the Red River delta. Upon arrival at Halong Bay, you will enjoy the flight above the limestone formations and breathtaking views of the bay from the bird's eye view.

Madam Nhu Huy is a Vietnam's gastronomy artisan and an expert in traditional Hue cuisine. She is a professor, author of cookbooks, a participant in various TV cooking shows in Vietnam and Europe, and the recipient of several prestigious Talent awards in Vietnam. Who could know more about Vietnamese cuisine than her?

This evening, you have a unique opportunity to learn the remarkable cuisine of Hue, which is known as the culinary capital of Vietnam. We will take you to Madam Nhu Huy's house, where you will try a mouth-watering dinner, created by one of the best master chefs in Vietnam. She is an expert in making the right balance of flavors as well as food presentation, where even a simple dish is a masterpiece. During the dinner, you will also listen to inspiring stories about her passion for culinary art, life, and career.

Explore the delicious world of Hue food with the celebrated gastronomy artisan - Madam Nhu Huy. She is a professor, author of cookbooks, a food television presenter in Vietnam and Europe, and the recipient of several prestigious Talent awards in Vietnam.

Start your tour with a visit to the local market to see the sights and sounds of daily life. Madam Nhu Huy will share some advice on how to select the freshest produce and ingredients necessary for Hue food. Later, visit several villages which each specialize in a different popular dish. During the day, sample many wonderful foods including com hen (mussel rice), banh beo, banh nam banh loc (varieties of soft rice cakes), and Hue sweet soups. These dishes are not merely considered local food, but an indispensable culinary trait of Hue.

Continue to the local restaurant Huyen Anh which serves Hue's specialty of banh uot and grilled pork. End the trip at Nhu Huy's house to taste more local food then return to your hotel.

Tam Giang Lagoon is the largest freshwater lagoon in Southeast Asia and a home to over 100,000 inhabitants. For hundreds of years, this has played a crucial role in the life of the local fishermen community. It is also known for its stunning views during the sunset sunset.

Start your exploration with a visit to An Dinh Palace, a stunning European-style palace and UNESCO World Cultural Heritage site. The next stop on our way to the lagoon is the Ru Cha mangrove forest, which acts as a natural barrier against the Thuan An Sea.

When the sun starts getting down, we will reach Chuon Lagoon (Tam Giang Lagoon), where you will take a boat trip to explore the lagoon. Pass by floating houses and take stunning sunset photos, enjoying the kaleidoscope of bright colors in the sky and authentic views of local fishermen at work. You can take part in various activities such as joining fishermen in catching fish, kayaking, or just swimming in the crystal blue water.

After the boat trip, we will stop at a local's house or restaurant to enjoy local specialty dishes or seafood and chat with the locals before getting back to the hotel.

Hue is known for its rich cultural heritage, royal charm, and authentic countryside. Today you will meet a professional photographer, who will take you through the hidden gems of Hue to take the most stunning and interesting photos and deep insight into the local life.

Meet Mrs. Ha Ton, who is a celebrated photographer of Hue. You will discuss the photographic art, and special techniques and learn about her interesting life experiences. Then, she will take you to Thanh Toan Village, where you will capture on camera the local daily life. Take a rest by a small Japanese-style covered bridge - Thanh Toan, dating back more than two centuries and which is a favorite spot for locals to rest in the shade. Visit the local market to view and photograph fresh produce and everyday local market sales. Continue to the peaceful Vong Canh Hill, a beautiful spot that reflects itself in the Perfume River and offers a panoramic view of the city during sunset.

Special Note: This tour is not recommended during October - February due to the weather conditions.

Explore the lesser-known destinations of graceful Hue exploring the rich cultural traditions, authentic local life, and scenic countryside views. You will not only visit meaningful places for Hue residents but also explore them on the back of the Vespa bike like all locals do.

Start your exploration with a visit to a local family temple, where you'll discover the rich traditions and obligations associated with Vietnamese family culture. Take a leisurely walk down the street and learn about the French colonial influence on the architecture of the beautiful riverside homes, and visit the bustling market, where you can witness the daily bustle of Vietnamese women and the sale of ancient worship materials.

Then, take a ferry to cross the Perfume River, where your Vespas will be waiting on the other side. 

Stroll around this UNESCO-listed temple complex to learn about the Cham culture, architecture, and civilization with Mr. Nguyen Thuong Hy, who has dedicated 35 years to the restoration and preservation of Southeast Asia's most significant architecture and relics. Before returning to Hoi An, enjoy a traditional lunch at Mr. Hy's nearby home.

Take photos of the buffalos grazing in the background and small boats, where people cast net fishing. This scene is particularly impressive during the rice planting or harvesting time. Within the village, you will be more than welcome to capture portraits of old people and children playing. Stop to share a cup of tea or a glass of cold beer with a local family. The boat ride back to Hoi An falls at a time when the sun offers its best colors. Return to town, where your driver will meet you and transfer you back to your hotel.

Special Note: This trip is not advised between October - February due to the rough weather conditions.

You will enjoy the true art of Champa culture while sharing the historical stories of exhibits and art performances told by Cham artists.

Many local artisans use sustainable materials and practices, which makes these crafts even more special. Listen to inspiring stories of the artisans about how they put meaning and messages in each intricate detail of their art and learn the basic techniques to use the chisel. Then, try your hands at making your craft under the guidance of our skillful artisans. Finish your work by painting your creations, and the masterpiece is done!

Later, you could visit the shop to buy sustainable handmade souvenirs for your loved ones before heading back to the hotel.

Hoi An at night is always busy with hundreds of food stalls and local restaurants. This evening, take a walk around the town and discover many vendors offering Hoi An specialties. This tour takes you off the beaten path to get a unique glimpse into the nightlife of this lovely ancient town and unforgettable street food.

Meet your tour guide and start zigzagging through the alleys to sample the most delicious local meals such as “white rose” (shrimp and pork dumpling cake with the shape of the rose), Vietnamese sandwich Banh Mi, which bustles with flavors and crispy fried wontons.

Then, we will visit a hidden family restaurant serving barbecued pork, which you can combine with fresh greens and herbs to create your own fresh spring roll. Walk further into the center of the village for a look at the ancient Ba Le Well, built in the 10th century by the Cham people. What is very special about it is that only water from this well can be used for preparing the Hoi An specialty Cao Lau noodles, which is our next culinary delight to try. Cao Lau comprises signature Hoi An noodles, slices of barbecue pork, pork crackling, bean sprouts, lettuce, and herbs. Finally, enjoy a desert of sweet soup “Che” before capping off the journey at the riverside to release floating lanterns for good luck.

The Cu Chi tunnel complex was dug in 1948 for the guerrillas to hide from French air and ground sweeps. It also served as communication routes, food and weapon caches, field hospitals, and living quarters for guerrilla fighters throughout the American war.

Today you will visit the underground villages with a Vietnam War veteran, who used to live there. His life experience will give you a better understanding of the tunnels' history, life in the tunnels, and the Vietnamese's resilience during the combats. Discuss with the veteran and find out about his experience living in the subterranean hamlets where lack of air, food, and water can make life unbearable. Two of the greatest pleasures of visiting Saigon are exploring its markets and sampling its legendary street food. Combine both in this culinary morning tour.

Meet your guide and drive to one of Saigon's most historic markets where you will learn about its history as you enjoy Banh Hoi Nem Nuong (grilled pork with rice vermicelli). Walk around the market to learn about fresh vegetables, seafood, and spices used in Vietnamese cooking with a stop at a small tofu factory to see how tofu and soya beans are made. Back at the market, enjoy a Vietnamese sweet like fresh yogurt, crème caramel (flan), or flavored gelatin. Wander around some of the market stalls, possibly including a shoe stall that makes wooden clogs to order. Cross the street for a taste of Banh Cuon Hanoi (steamed rice flour crepe stuffed with pork), washed down with a sinh to (Vietnamese smoothie) or Nuoc Mia (sugar cane juice). Taste savory rice flour cakes like Banh Xeo and Banh Khot or fresh spring rolls before ending with a Vietnamese sweet pudding before heading back to your hotel.

Wake up early this morning and start your day like a real Saigonese does! Your guide will show you things that make Saigon so different, compared to other parts of Vietnam, from the morning crowded street coffee places to the lively local outdoor markets, where people shop for their daily needs.

Your first stop is a Vietnamese bread stall, which is believed to be the first bread stall in Saigon. Sit down together with the local people inside a small alley to enjoy this simple, yet delicious breakfast. After breakfast, zig-zag through the alleys and stop at a market for a cup of tea or coffee in Saigon's oldest café. This coffee shop is now in its 78th year of operation. Meet the owner for a talk to learn how she makes coffee with such a special yet traditional method called "stocking coffee". Continue to wind your way through nearby street markets to see how people bargain for fresh vegetables, seafood, and other local food. Carry on to the "flower alleys" - the biggest flower market in Saigon. Take the opportunity to see the colorful blossoms, and interact with the sellers. Stop at some vendors to try some favorite Saigonese snacks and desserts such as sponge cakes and sweet soups before heading back to your hotel.

She blows brilliant twists on traditional art techniques to create easier drawing methods. Uyen is also a master of Vietnamese musical instruments. Enjoy the live folk tunes performed by her, sip a cup of Vietnamese tea, and admire the artworks presented in the studio.

The best way to learn about vegan food is to go to an organic farm, where you will learn more about plants and their nutrition. Today you will pick up all your vegetables, mushrooms, and fruits to create nice and fancy vegan dishes following the master chef's instructions.

After breakfast at the hotel, meet your guide at 07:30 a.m., and you will drive to Ho Chi Minh Agricultural Villages. Spend time exploring the villages and visiting Cow and buffalo areas. Then you will visit rice fields, and prawn, chicken, and duck areas.

Then, the rowing boat will take you deeper into the countryside on smaller canals to enjoy a peaceful time. Visit a fishing village by Sampan, cycle around the local village to visit a mushroom farm, and enjoy tropical fruit at the grapefruit orchard. You will also meet with the weaving artisans to see how they produce beautiful home products. Then, enjoy some sweets with a cup of hot tea and home-hosted lunch at a local family, before visiting a rice wine workshop. Return to the mainland and get transferred back to Saigon.

Leave Ho Chi Minh early in the morning for a 1.5-hour drive to Ben Tre, the gateway to the Mekong Delta with sprawling rice paddies and colorful fruit farms. Arrive at the quaint An Khanh hamlet, where you will visit a small home factory that makes traditional sticky rice covered by coconut leaves. Meet with the owner and her hard-working team who will teach you about how they use century-old traditional methods to make this special and tasty cake.

Continue this rural journey to meet a local family in Quoi Son village to learn more about the local way of living. After wandering through the lush gardens of this village, hop on the motorboat for a thirty-minute excursion passing by peaceful scenes of countryside living. Disembark at a local ship-building workshop and meet the owner, who has perfected his craft, learning it from three generations of river boat-makers before him. Change the boat for a bicycle and enjoy a relaxing ride through the narrow village with fruit orchards and cozy cottages. At the end of the cycling trip, sample exotic fresh fruits right from the garden. Then choose between riding a horse-drawn cart or tri-motorcycle through the lush surroundings of the fruit farms before boarding a sampan for a pleasure trip along the narrow canals of the Mekong. End your excursion at a local farmer's house, where lunch of Mekong Delta specialties will be served before driving back to Saigon.



Jim Thompson is credited with revitalizing the Thai silk industry, and the museum features various items used in silk production, along with informative boards on the process of silkworm harvesting, spinning, and weaving.

Another notable museum that you will visit today is the Suan Pakkad Palace, which was once the home of Prince Paripatra. It is located on Sri Ayutthaya Road, south of the Victory Monument. The museum showcases a range of Thai antiques, including Ban Chiang pottery that dates back over 4,000 years.

In the evening, your private driver will take you to the Metropolitan Hotel, where Nahm Restaurant is located.

Enjoy the fine dining experience at the restaurant, that is one of the "World's 50 Best Restaurants" and has a Michelin star.

The museum features a vast collection of priceless antiques collected by Jim Thompson along with various items used in silk production and informative boards about the process of silkworm harvesting, spinning, and weaving. After visiting the museum, spend some time in the famous Jim Thompson's shop, where you can purchase fine silk products.

Have a stop for a cup of coffee at the Bangkok Tree House on the Chao Phraya River. Sit and relax enjoying the drink and panoramic view of the city. Then, we continue cycling to visit the tropical fruit garden, the integrated farming system in the forest to see how locals grow the fruits. Enjoy lunch at the local restaurant or at the local Thai family house. In the afternoon, we will visit the folk museum and take a boat trip through the mangrove forest in a Thai-style boat. We will get back to the mainland by the long tail boat and transfer you to your hotel.

Today you will explore the charm of Bangkok's neighborhood and build a deeper connection with the local religious culture. Start your day by taking a long-tail boat along the Chao Phraya to explore Thonburi, a riverside settlement once known as "Money Town." You will visit beautiful temples along the riverbank, witnessing the Buddhist ceremony of almsgiving at Wat Kanlayanamit Temple. You will also explore the local Kudi Jeen neighborhood and visit Santa Cruz Church, one of the oldest Catholic churches in Bangkok.

Then your reserved vehicle will take you past the Royal Navy Hall to Wat Arun, the 'Temple of Dawn', one of Bangkok's most striking attractions. You will pass through the back streets of the pagoda and learn about its history.

Next, you will be transferred by air-conditioned vehicle to Wat Rakhang, the "Temple of the Bell" to explore the former residence of the Supreme Patriarch and make merit by feeding catfish, a feature of Buddhism. Your guide will introduce you to Wang Lang Market, a unique square with countless nutritious foods and mouth-watering dishes. The highlight of the trip will be participation in the SangkaTan ritual. It is a tradition of offering food and necessary things for Buddhist monks or making some donations for the Buddhist community. We can offer SangkaTan to monks during the temple visit, we recommend you to do it in the morning, when monks are gathering to bless people. Take part in libation (Grud Nam), when the monk pours water and chants the libation mantra for your blessing. Then this water will be poured into the tree to share the merit with your ancestors to protect you.



The flight in a hot air balloon will be a magical adventure that gives you a panoramic view of the whole Angkor Wat complex. From the height of 200m, you will immerse yourself in the morning breeze with fresh air and beautiful sunrise views.

Start the day by exploring relatively untouched villages and learning about the daily lives of the locals. This is a world away from Siem Reap and gives you the perfect opportunity to get 'off the beaten track'. The first stop is one of the small villages with rice plantations and farmers busy working in their fields. If you want, you can join them for some hands-on experience with farming. October and November are harvest seasons so you'll spend time in the rice fields learning how to harvest!

The trip uses a mode of travel more typical for this area. The (almost) pollution-free cart is still widely used throughout Cambodia and allows you to travel at a gentle, almost hypnotic pace along the narrow, village roads. We then visit the home of a local family and participate in cooking homemade local meals that you will have for lunch. You will have plenty of time to relax and chat with the family to learn better about local life and Khmer cuisine.

In the afternoon, we will visit Wat Bo, a highly respected temple founded in the 18th century, which has very unique murals of Reamker (Ramayana). Continue the tour by visiting "Les Artisans d'Angkor - Chantiers Ecole", the most authentic Khmer Arts and Crafts. This project greatly supports the local community by providing training and employment opportunities for people from poor families and preserving traditional Cambodian arts. End our visit at one of the city's vibrant open markets, Psar Chars also known as the "Old Market", where anything and everything is for sale.



DAY TRIP TO MONIVONG BOKOR NATIONAL PARK

Meet your guide in the morning and depart for Kampot town with a countryside scenic 2-hours drive, where you will enjoy the views of palm trees, and rice fields. On the way, we will stop at the Ropang Ropov Fishing Village.

Upon arrival, we will visit the Kampot Market to observe the local way of life through lively commercial scenes. Then, we will drive up to the Bokor National Park. The 140 thousand hectares of this park are untouched mountain jungles and are home to the biggest herd of wild elephants in Southeast Asia. Most of the park's area is covered by mountains with the highest peak Kamtjaj Mountain, which is 1077 metres above sea level. After exploring the park, we will drive around Kampot Town to admire the Classic French Colonial architecture and the riverside walkways, where you will see more French Colonial Buildings. Afterward, we will enjoy the delicious lunch and make our way back to Phnom Penh.

Today your guide will meet you at the hotel and take you to the Silk Island on the Mekong River. You will visit the old village, which maintains the art of silk weaving. See the entire process of silk production from growing the worm, extracting the string, coloring, designing the pattern, and weaving. All the work is handmade in the traditional way. It takes up to one week to produce one meter of fabric, but the result is a masterpiece. Many Cambodians buy fabric from this village to make the traditional dress for the wedding ceremony.

On-site, you can visit the shop, where you can purchase organic and hand-made silk items. Later, we will have a cycling trip around the island and have lunch tasting the local meal in the rustic floating restaurant overlooking the Mekong River.
